Attendance Matters; Every Day Counts

Our annual attendance is currently at 93%! Our target is 96%.

Remember it is important that your child attends school every day. Poor attendance affects attainment and progress and can affect friendships at school. It is a parent's responsibility to make sure that their child attends school regularly and on time.

What is a Parent Governor?

School governors are committed volunteers who help run the school, making sure that the school provides the best possible education for all its pupils. Parent governors play a vital role on governing bodies, holding the unique position of having a parental viewpoint of the school and playing an important role in managing, supporting and improving the school.

Parent Governors are elected by parents at the school.

Parent Governors are asked to:

- Attend all full governing body meetings, usually 4 per year
- Attend any subcommittee meetings they are involved in.
- Read any papers circulated before meetings
- Visit the school as part of a programme of governor visits with a specific focus
