


Dates for your diary!

A couple of reminders...



Show you care... Please park elsewhere!

I would like to remind all parents that when dropping off and picking up your child/children:

- Vehicles MUST always be parked legally so as not to cause an obstruction.
- Please do not park on the yellow zig zag markings at the front of the school.
- Do NOT park too close to a road junction.
- Please do not pull alongside parked cars to allow your children to 'jump in' or 'jump out'.

There have been a number of complaints about vehicles reversing in to the school playground. Please DO NOT park on Stockholm Street (where the big gates are). The street is narrow and there is little room to turn a car round. Remember it is illegal to park on the yellow zig zag road markings outside school and it is putting our children's lives at risk. Please also respect the residents who live on Stockholm Street.

Remember: The children's safety is a greater priority than convenient parking which puts children's lives at risk. Unsafe parking is unacceptable.

Attendance and Punctuality

Our expectations for good and outstanding attendance are:

98%-100%	Purple-Excellent attendance- This will significantly help with a pupils achievement and attainment and life in school. This gives pupils a good start in life and supports a positive work ethic
96%-97%	Green–Good attendance-This is a solid platform to build upon and pupils should aspire to improve. This is in line with National average.
91%-95%	Yellow-Poor attendance-Pupils with this level of attendance are below the national average for attendance which may begin to affect their attainment and progress at school. It may also begin to impact on relationships with their peers.
Below 90%	Red – High Risk- Absence at 90% is classified as Persistent Absence. Absence is a serious concern. This level of absence significant affects attainment and progress as well as relationships with their peers. It is unaccepatable within the schools expectations and targeted support strategies will immediately put in place for improvement.

Medical/Dental Appointments

Parents are advised where possible to make appointments outside of the school day. Where this is not possible, pupils should attend school for part of the day and parents will be asked to show the appointment card.

Holidays in Term Time

We are <u>not</u> allowed to authorise holidays or trips during term time. Parents need to be aware that if their child is out of school for holidays or trips, legal action for unauthorised absences is taken.

- Each parent/carer will receive a Penalty Notice of £120.00 for each child. This will be reduced to £60.00 if paid within 21 days of the fine being issued.
- Any such Penalty Notice or prosecution may relate to your child's attendance record both prior to and subsequence to this letter.
- Each parent/carer may receive a court summons, which may lead to a criminal record and a fine.
- Your child is also at risk of losing their school place.

The Government have made it very clear that children have 13 weeks holidays from school to use to go away

Our expectations for punctuality are:

That all pupils arrive on time and are ready to learn. Good time keeping is a vital life skill which will help our children as they progress through their life.

The school doors are open to pupils from 8.50am and will close at 9.00am.

If your child arrives after 9.00am they must enter through the main entrance and sign in as late. The school registers close at 9.30am and any pupil who arrives after this time without good reason will incur an unauthorised absence.
