What impact/intended impact/sustainability are you expecting?

- 1. Staff will have increased confidence, knowledge and skills to enable them to team teach games lessons alongside a specialist coach.
- 2. More children are engaged in regular physical activity and sporting activities during lunchtime, based on feedback from pupil voice focus group and CSA voice
- 3. To raise the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- 4. A broader and more equal experience of a range of sports has been offered. Children have a greater understanding of inclusion in sporting activities.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sports
- a) Children have attended offsite tournaments and participated in mirrored onsite competitive activities at school.

How will you know? What **evidence** do you have or expect to have?

- 1. Teacher voice impact on games lessons, Coach feedback linked to teaching observed during team teach sessions.
- 2. Pupil voice linked to lunchtime activity opportunities. Focus group of hard to reach children feedback on ways of overcoming barriers. CSA voice what the children want and need.
- 3. Accurate and accessible assessment systems are created to enable purposeful data analysis using iTrack. The outcomes of analysis will direct future work to further narrow the gap for under achieving children.
- 4. Pupil voice, staff voice, parent voice
- 5. Competitions have been attended
